Accepting proposals now for fall 2015!

Proposals will be accepted until May 4, 2015, from faculty, staff, and retirees interested in being considered as presenters for the Daniel J. Doyle Technology & Society Colloquia Series, opening in fall 2015.



Following a successful Centennial Colloquia Series, Pennsylvania College of Technology President Davie Jane Gilmour announced the colloquia series would be continued and dedicated in honor of Professor Emeritus and Master Teacher Daniel J. Doyle.

A committee, led by Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost Paul L. Starkey, will organize the 2015-16 series. Committee members are Thomas E. Ask, professor, industrial and human factors design; Rob R. Cooley, professor, anthropology/environmental science; Elaine J. Lambert, special assistant to the president for creative development and public relations; Wendy A. Miller, director of academic services; Mark D. Noe, professor, English composition; and Richard C. Taylor, associate professor, plumbing and heating.

The proposal should be submitted via e-mail as a document that includes the following information:

- Your name and contact information (phone and email)
- Your preferred semester for the presentation (fall 2015 or spring 2016)
- Working title of presentation
- Abstract (with enough information to facilitate the committee's understanding of your content)
- A brief bibliography (title, author, publication date)

Proposals should be developed under the following guidelines:

Purpose

- Engage students, faculty, staff, and the community in an academic enrichment activity
- Extend the students' classroom experiences
- Provide a forum for faculty and staff to share their research and expertise
- Celebrate the historic and continuing commitment of the institution to applied technology

Format

- Evening presentations of 45 minutes to one hour plus Q & A; reception to follow
- All presentations must relate to technology and society theme
- Venue will be identified (ACC Auditorium, PDC Mountain Laurel Room, SASC Presentation Room, CC Penn's Inn)
- Presentation will be videotaped
- May be a single presenter or a collaboration, particularly of an interdisciplinary nature.

Commitment of presenters

- Provide a bibliography
- Consider adoption for in-class use
- Provide material for press releases/ brochures as requested
- Agree to media interviews, if requested
- Agree to placement of recorded presentation on YouTube, if requested

Commitment to presenters

- \$500 stipend
- Assistance (as requested) with preparation of visuals
- Promotion of the event both internally and externally

Schedule

- Proposal deadline: May 4, 2015
- Those selected to give presentations in fall 2015 will be notified prior to the summer break.
- Plans are to offer two programs led by Penn College presenters, one by a regional academic presenter, and one by a nationally-known presenter in 2015-16.
